- **Áŋpétu: day**
 - Wíchokaŋhiyaye. It is noon.
 - Áŋpéčhokaya: Midday, noon
 - Lé áŋpétu kiŋ/áŋpétu kiŋ lé: This day, today
 - Áŋpétu kiŋ haŋ: During this day

 - **Áŋpétu tókča: weather**
 - Áŋpétu tókča he? What is the weather like today?
 - OwáštečakA: Pleasant weather
 - ÁŋpówaštečakA: A day with good weather
 - Ošíčeča: Bad weather
 - Áŋpšíčeča: A day with bad weather
 - Tšąŋkál tšatéte. It's windy outside.
 - Tšąŋkál mağážu. It's rainy outside.
 - Tšąŋkál wasú hiŋhé. It's hailing outside.
 - Wígmųŋke waŋbláke. I see a rainbow.

 - **Áŋpéčhokaya wótapi: Lunch**
 - Thimá hiyú na wóta ye/yo. Come inside and eat.
 - Thimá hiyú na wóta pe/po. You all come inside and eat.
 - Ečháš thimá hiyú na wóta ye/yo. You must come inside and eat.
 - Ečháš thimá hiyú na wóta pe/po. You all must come inside and eat.
 - Wóta ye/yo. Eat.
 - Wóta pe/po. You all eat.
 - Loyáčiŋ he/hwo? Are you hungry?
 - Loyáčiŋpi he/hwo? Are you all hungry?

 - **YatkÁŋ: To drink**
 - Mní yatkáŋ ye/yo. Drink water.
 - Háŋpi yatkáŋ ye/yo. Drink juice.
 - Tšaspáŋhaŋpi yatkáŋ ye/yo. Drink apple juice.
 - Mní pńá yatkáŋ ye/yo. Drink lemonade.
